Dear Parents and Community Members,

Thank you for taking the time to review our school's State Report Card. The State Report Cards are produced by the Oregon Department of Education and their purpose is to provide a broad overview of how each school is doing. This year the U. S. Department of Education has given the State of Oregon approval to temporarily suspend the assignment of school ratings during the transition from the Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (OAKS) to the new college and career readiness assessments. Schools will not receive an overall school rating on this report card.

Even without an overall rating we can still tell that many of our students continue to show growth in the areas of reading, math and science and we celebrate their success! However, we are not

seeing the kind of growth that we would like to see for all of our student groups. Our staff continues to focus closely on students who are Economically Disadvantaged, English Language Learners and students with Special Education needs. As in years past, we believe that our student growth is something to be proud of but also provides us with direction towards improvement.

We are proud to do this work and to serve this community each day. Thank you for your continued partnership in this process. Please feel free to call me with any questions that you might have regarding our School Report Card.

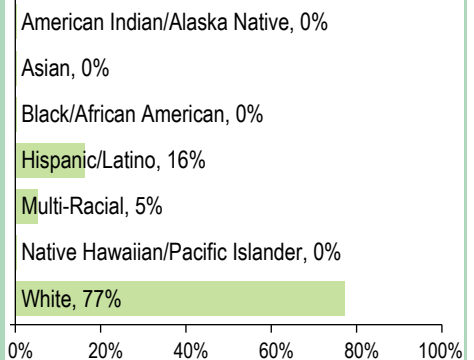

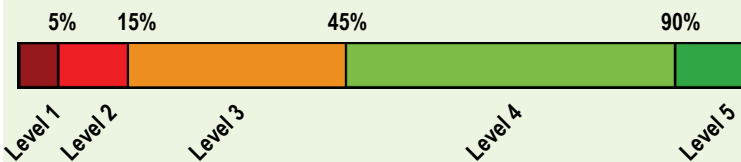
