

# KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

*Your child is eligible for kindergarten if he or she is five years old by September 1, 2018. Registration is necessary and takes place at the elementary school in your official attendance area.*

## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Each elementary school hosts a Kindergarten Registration event where families have the opportunity to register their child. Be sure to bring proof of age, such as the birth certificate, and immunization records. Schedule:

## Immunization Information

All students in Canby School District must comply with the Oregon State immunization requirements as follows:

**DTaP:** 5 doses unless the 4<sup>th</sup> dose was received at or after 4 years of age, in which case only 4 doses are required.

**POLIO:** 4 doses unless the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose was given at or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday in which case the child is complete with 3 doses.

**MEASLES:** 2 doses

**MUMPS:** 1 dose (must have received after 12 months of age)

**RUBELLA:** 1 dose (must have received after 12 months of age)

**HEPATITIS A:** 2 doses

**HEPATITIS B:** 3 doses

**VARICELLA (Chicken Pox):** 1 dose or a history of disease.

**CONTACT** your family physician or county health services for information and/or immunization records.

## REGISTRATION PACKET

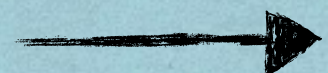
Kindergarten students will be registered when all of the required forms are completed and returned to your child's school.

- Copy of birth certificate or other proof of age
- Parent Survey
- Home Language Survey
- Oregon Pupil Health Record (a physical is recommended, but not required)

# FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN



Our mission for Canby School District's full-day kindergarten program is to establish classrooms with joyful rigor that provide a strong foundation for learning, increased opportunities for exploration, enrichment of core academics, and intentional development of school and social habits in order for students to grow into successful, independent learners.

The Canby School District examined research and met with full-day kindergarten staff from other districts to guide our work of crafting a program to best meet the needs of Canby students. The kindergarten day will be the same length as grades one through six.

Parents with concerns regarding their student's participation in full-day kindergarten should share this information with your school principal. They will work with you to form a plan that addresses the needs of your student.

## Full-Day Kindergarten:

### Increases academic achievement:

- Children in full-day classes show greater reading and mathematics achievement gains than those in half-day classes.<sup>2</sup>
- Full-day kindergarten enables teachers to assess students' needs and abilities more effectively, leading to early intervention that can close achievement gaps.

### Improves Attendance:

- Children in full-day kindergarten programs have better attendance in kindergarten and through the primary grades.<sup>1</sup>

### Improves Social Skills:

- Full-day kindergarten contributes to children's development of other essential learning skills that support social competence and creative problem-solving.<sup>3</sup>
